



ScrapHouse Frequently Asked Questions

What is ScrapHouse?

A single-family, demonstration house, built entirely with scrap and salvaged materials.

When is ScrapHouse open to the public?

Thursday, June 2 - Sunday, June 5, 2005

10:00am - 8:00pm

In conjunction with World Environment Day 2005

Where is ScrapHouse located?

On Civic Center Plaza, immediately across the street from San Francisco City Hall, at the corner of Grove St. and Polk.

Who built it?

ScrapHouse was designed and constructed by a rockstar team of local artists, engineers, architects, city officials, and builders.

How big is ScrapHouse?

The house itself is approximately 700 square feet. At its highest point, the house is 28 feet tall, allowing for a second-story mezzanine bedroom.

What will happen to ScrapHouse after June 5?

Ideally, the house will be disassembled, moved, and relocated on a permanent site. To donate or suggest a site, please email rachel@scraphouse.org.
